From the President:

Hello Heron Cay residents and welcome to April! March was a busy month in our neighborhood and FP&L continues its work in April installing new lighting throughout our community. Hopefully the project will be completed by the end of this month. As you walk or ride through the neighborhood, you may have noticed that we have four new benches installed in strategic places around Heron Cay for you to take a little break. I understand that more benches will be coming. And, for some fun, a large checkerboard game has been installed near the fire pit, next to the giant chess game. Management will be supplying shuffleboard sticks for ease in pushing the checkers or chess pieces around the boards. The plan is that the sticks will be stored in a box near the gameboard but in the meantime, you can get them in the sports equipment storage area in the auditorium. This month we start to say goodbye to our "snowbirds" as they head back north for the summer. Safe travels to you all and we'll see you in the fall!

From the Board of Directors:

This month, April 22nd marks the 54th anniversary of "Earth Day," an annual celebration that honors the achievements of the environmental movement and raises awareness of the need to protect Earth's natural resources for future generations. The first Earth Day was held April 22, 1970, and was organized by U.S. Senator Gaylord Nelson to draw attention to the negative effects of modern life on the environment. The April 22 date was selected, in part, because it fell between colleges' spring break and final exams and also from the observance of Arbor Day, which began in Nebraska in 1872, a day when people are encouraged to plant trees. Heron Cay management is working with the HOA in planning something to celebrate Earth Day in our community. In addition,

I would encourage our residents and hope we can each do our own small part this year. Remember – Earth is our only home.

Passover starts on the evening of April 22nd and ends on the evening of April 30th. The eight-day Jewish holiday of Passover commemorates the emancipation of the Israelites from slavery in ancient Egypt. In Hebrew the holiday is Pesach, which means to pass over, "because God passed over the Jewish homes when killing the Egyptian firstborn on the very first Passover eve." The holiday is marked with Seder meals that incorporate a retelling of the story of Exodus, accompanied by four cups of wine, bitter herbs and matzah. Matzah is an unleavened bread that is eaten throughout the holiday. Leavened bread is off the menu and the matzah is representative of the unleavened bread that was a staple for Israelites on their journey out of Egypt. We wish all of our Jewish friends a Happy Passover!

Heron Cay's own "Artist," Jennifer Hammer, has been a Heron Cay resident living on Bimini Cay for five years now. She retired at the age of 70 from a corporate career in credit



management and moved here near her sister who also resides in Heron Cay. She was born in Wales, Great Britain, but hails from Ohio. "I never taught in a school or college, but my love of art, and the relaxation I enjoy when being creative, has brought me complete joy," she stated. "And, I sometimes forget to eat, which isn't a bad thing," she joked. Jennifer holds art classes on Tuesdays at 8:45 am in the clubhouse. She also teaches art classes in Port St. Lucie. Her technique, in teaching people to paint, focuses on brush usage and demonstrates the many uses that each brush can provide to the artist. "I teach the students how to choose the right paint brushes to get the job done," she said. Jennifer believes, "If an artist has the right brush in their hand, they can paint anything." And her Heron Cay students have shown that their brushes can do just

that! From paintings of an ocean as seen through an open window, (shown in the picture above), to paintings on tissue boxes portraying swans nesting in a pool of water, her projects are beautifully brought to life by the students. She offers classes throughout the year. Stop by on a Tuesday morning and find out for yourself what this wonderful program is all about.



The **1965 Ford Mustang** was developed in record time on a shoe-string budget. It was introduced by Ford at the World's Fair on April 17, 1964, to instant acclaim. Ford planned for 100,000 first-year sales, but dealers sold 22,000 on the first day with a price tag of \$2,368. Today, the 2024 Ford Mustang price range is \$30,920 - \$57,970.





Did you know that the Professional Golfers' Association of America was established on April 10, 1916, thanks to Rodman Wanamaker, a New York businessman, and Tom McNamara of Brookline, Massachusetts, an outstanding player and talented individual, who planned a luncheon on January 17, 1916, where sixty influencers were invited. McNamara was able to convince

Wanamaker that it was a prime time to bring U.S. professionals together and that the publicity would be beneficial to Wanamaker who was locked into a retail battle with rival A.G. Spalding & Bros. for the sale of golf balls. Wanamaker enthusiastically approved the initiative. Consisting of nearly 29,000 members, the PGA of America's undertaking is to establish and elevate the standards of the profession and to grow interest and participation in the game of golf.

In 1968, the PGA Tour was spun off from the PGA of America as a separate organization to administer professional golf tours. On December 4, 2018, the PGA of America announced plans to relocate its headquarters from Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, to a planned 600-acre mixed-use development in Frisco, Texas. The Frisco site has two golf courses: Fields Ranch East and Fields Ranch West.

It's not too late to become a 2024 member of the Heron Cay HOA. Visit the HOA office located



in the clubhouse during office hours on Tuesdays from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm or Thursdays from 1:30 pm to 2:30 pm. There is an application on the HOA website: www.heroncayhoa.org Membership costs \$25 per year, per household and membership cards will be issued to all household

members who are on the lease and a bonafide homeowner. You may also become a lifetime member with one fee of \$150. If you are new to Heron Cay, bring your title or registration form that shows ownership of a home within the community. Regardless of how many members are on the lease or owners, only one member who is an owner can vote in the election, and may cast one vote during the annual HOA Board of Directors elections held in February. Eligible household members will be issued a membership card for access to HOA monthly business meetings and the annual membership meeting, and members get password access to the members-only section of the HOA website. The HOA also offers discounts to its membership on any events sponsored by the HOA or any of its committees. No membership fees will be collected by the HOA Fun 'n Games Committee.





Lot Rent 90-day Notices issued to homeowners whose lease agreements are renewable July 2024 reflect February Consumer Price Index (CPI) figures as determined by the US Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The February 2024 figure is **491.741** up from **474.128** for February 2023, an increase of **3.7** %.

Compare to last year's increase of 6.4 %.

Please note that the amount of increase may not result in a new lot rent in excess of market rent.

Beautiful Creatures in our Community

The North American River Otter!


This water-loving animal is a Florida native found in all areas of the state except the Keys. River

otters can be found in many types of freshwater bodies including lakes and ponds. Otters usually live in burrows on the bank of the water body, often under tree roots or other structures. Adult river otters can weigh 10 to 30 pounds and grow as large as five feet in length. As many as four otters together have purportedly been seen in our lake, a very unusual sight!

Otters are powerful swimmers and eat a wide variety of prey including fish, turtles, birds and small mammals. The picture of the otter in our lake shows a substantial large-mouth bass about to be the otter's supper!

Do not approach an otter. They're cute but can also get nasty so give them a wide berth and

female with her pup.



Never feed an otter, like raccoons, otters will go into your trash if the smell is inviting and they have become familiar with human interaction.

Please respect and enjoy our community's wildlife.

Gate Entry System

Our Gate Entry system is called a LiftMaster. It has many features to help make our community more secure. The gate entry codes were updated from 4 to 5 digits back in the early summer of 2022. If you have not yet changed your code with the office, please do so. You may want to check the gate entry system box to determine if your name is in the community list. You can do that by visiting the box and using the arrows to scroll up and down to find your name.

A person can gain entry by a couple of ways:

- 1. Residents may gain entry by using:
 - a. their 5 digit gate entry code, simply follow prompts on gate entry system box.
 - b. AND, of course, the resident may gain entry by using their remotes or their fobs.
- 2. Guests may gain entry by using:
 - a. a resident's 5 digit gate access (entry) code, simply follow prompts on gate entry system box. Although, ELS does encourage residents to **NOT** share your entry access entry code with others. Instead, have them utilize the calling feature.
- 3. Calling feature:
 - a. Guests may gain entry by using the LiftMaster touch screen. Instructional prompts are on the screen.
 - b. If the guest uses the calling method, you will receive a phone call from the gate or from the phone number of **772-999-6854**.
 - c. After speaking with the guest and deciding to allow the guest entry, the resident may open the gates by pressing **#9** on their phone keypad.
- 4. Suggestion: Program the gate phone number of 772-999-6854 into your contact list on your phone.


