

AMENDMENTS TO YOUR PROSPECTUS:

By now you should have received a Notice of Amendments to your Prospectus. Please be sure to read the changes which will go into effect August 1, 2024. There are specific new regulations, as well as deletions that you need to be aware of that could adversely affect you. The amendments read in part:

RENT: All rental payments shall be due and payable ON OR BEFORE THE FIRST (1st) day of each month. A late fee will be assessed for each month lot rental amount payment is not received by the 5th day of the prospective month.....Residents are required to make payments using electronic payment methods.... No checks will be accepted.

ROOFS: Roofs are no longer restricted to gabled fiberglass shingles but they still must be "management approved."

DRIVEWAYS: Driveways can now be painted or pressure washed.

SECOND RESIDENT: A second applicant must be no less than 45 years of age.

PETS: Only two pets are permitted per household. All pets must be registered with the Community Manager and be up to date on their registration and shots. Certain breeds will not be permitted in the community due to their size and/or aggressive natures.

We have provided you with the highlights. We strongly advise that you carefully read the entire notice so that you are familiar with any changes in your prospectus.

REMEMBER, being on the NHW is an easy way to give back to your community. You can walk, bike, drive your golf cart or vehicle. Walkers and bikers are great for the morning hours and drivers are best for night hours. NHW is only the EYES and EARS for the sheriff's office. Interested? Give me a call @ 772-567-6128.

Have you noticed the flashing yellow lights at night? Those flashing lights let residents know that the car/golf cart driving SLOWLY on our streets belong to a Neighborhood Watch member.

If a Watch member notices a car, shed, house or screen room door open at night, we stop and mention it to the resident. This is for your safety and convenience. If no one answers, we will call the sheriff's office. We will not close anyone's property. Deputies have the authority to fully investigate the unusual. Most times when doors are left open at night it's because the resident forgot to close it and is very thankful.

For YOUR safety always walk against traffic, bike with the traffic and follow the SLOW speed in the community. When walking two or more abreast, please move to single file when approaching a moving vehicle. It is not safe for the approaching vehicle to move into the oncoming lane. THIS IS FOR YOUR SAFETY.

SAFETY INFORMATION:

Hurricane season begins June 1 and goes through November 30. This year's predictions are not looking good. Here are some helpful hints:

1. Make a plan - write down emergency phone numbers, prepare an emergency supply kit, locate the nearest shelter and different routes you can take to get there if you need to evacuate

2. Gather emergency supplies - an emergency food and water supply, medicine supply, power sources such as flashlights (batteries), safety and personal items, important documents including medical, wills, passports and personal ID's.

3. Know the difference between a hurricane watch and warning:

A watch means hurricane conditions (sustained winds of 74 mph or higher) are possible in your area.

A warning is more serious. It means hurricane winds are expected in your area.

4. Get your car ready - fill your gas tank and keep an emergency kit in your car.

5. Get your home ready: clean your yard of anything that can blow around and become a missile (bikes, lawn furniture, grills, propane tanks). Cover your windows, use storm shutters or plywood to protect.

6. Be ready to evacuate when authorities recommend doing so. Do not ignore an order. Staying home to protect your property is not worth risking your health and safety.

If you need to evacuate, grab your emergency supply kit and take what you need (cell phone, chargers, medicines, ID's like a passport or driver's license and cash).

Remember power could be out for a number of days and ATM's won't be working. Credit and debit cards won't be of any use. Gas pumps will not be able to pump gas.

Also keep a weather radio (battery operated) available. Listen to the TV or radio for updates. Just stay alert. Remember we live in manufactured homes which are not safe in a High Cat 3 and above hurricane. I have lived here through many storms and we have had a lot of destruction in these higher cat storms.

BEAUTIFUL SPECIMENS In Our Community



AGAVE ATTENUATA

Agave Attenuata is a flowering plant in the Asparagaceae family, native to Mexico. Other common names are Foxtail Agave, Lion's Tail Agave or Swan's Neck Agave.

Agave Attenata is popular in garden bed settings as the sea green leaves do not have teeth or thorns, hence a touch friendly "soft-tipped" agave. To keep the plant's rosette tidy, scissor off the lowest ring of leaves as they turn brown and curled.

After many years of slow growth, a healthy specimen will develop a very large, curved flower stalk which is much taller than the plant itself. The flower stalk grows out of the top of the rosette after 15 to 20 years and is very large, often over 6 feet in length and usually curved. The base plant dies after seeds develop on the flower stalk, but hopefully, many suckers have already sprouted from the base and/or flower stalk.

This succulent does well in

large pots or in-ground, always well-drained. The suckers that grow from the base can be brought along to a modest size, 8-10 inches, then carefully removed to a new pot or in-ground location. Do not allow pets to eat or chew on this plant; the sap is not healthy to human skin.

At least one local nursery, Rock City Gardens, often offers small, but pricey, specimens.
