#### SO, THIS IS OCTOBER - DID YOU KNOW THAT...

Of course, we celebrate Halloween ("All Hallows Eve") on October 31<sup>st</sup> but before that, we have some pretty cool holidays such as:

October 1 is International Coffee Day and National Homemade Cookie Day. It's also National Pumpkin Spice Day so you can perk up your coffee and sprinkle your cookies – what could be better?

October 2 brings us Guardian Angel Day, as well as the International Day of Non-Violence.

October 2 also begins the two-day celebration of one of Judaism's high holy days, Rosh Hashanah, which means "start of the year" in the Hebrew language and commemorates the creation of the world.

October 3 is National Wide Awake Day as well as National Boyfriend Day. So, does that mean that you can go into that new relationship fully aware??

October 3 marks the first day of the Hindu festival of Navaratri. Spanning over nine nights, Navaratri is one of the most revered festivals in Hinduism and celebrates the Mother Goddess Durga. Navaratri is observed four times a year and the festivals are named after the Hindu seasons during which they fall. The autumn observation of Sharad Navaratri falls during the lunar month of Ashwin and symbolizes the start of winter.

October 4 is World Smile Day as well as World Animal Day (what a great combination – who can resist a little puppy?) It's also National Vodka Day and Ships-in-bottles Day. So drink up and you, too, can build a teeny tiny little sailboat!

October 5 has some fun celebrations such as National Be Nice Day, National Do Something Nice Day, National Card-Making Day and National Get Funky Day. OK now: how about combining these and making some cool cards to send to friends. That would be nice.

October 6 gives us National Transfer Money to Your Daughter Day (there's actually a day devoted to this??? – I thought it was a year round thing!) It's also National Noodle Day. Huh?

October 7 is National Chocolate Covered Pretzel Day. Oooh. Oooh. Me!! Me!! It's the World Day of Bullying Prevention and the International Day of Peaceful Communication. This is a great day to make new friends and share some pretzels.

October 8 sees some food days – National Pierogi Day, National Salmon Day and World Octopus Day. Yummy – but not necessarily at the same time.

October 9 is International Beer and Pizza Day. Woo hooo!

October 11 is It's My Party Day. Fortunately, it falls on a Friday this year so workers can party and have the next day off.

October 11 is another major Jewish holiday, Yom Kippur. The highest of Judaism's holy days, Yom Kippur is a day of atonement, as Jews believe it is on this day that God decides each person's fate. Jewish people observe Yom Kippur with a 25-hour fast and intensive prayer at a special synagogue service as they ask God for the forgiveness of their sins committed over the past year. In 2024, Yom Kippur begins at sundown on Friday, October 11, and ends at nightfall the following evening, October 12. Since Yom Kippur is the most solemn day, Jewish people also do not go to work or school. Using anything electronic is prohibited and Hassidic Jews don't even use water to bathe, drink or brush their teeth. At the end of Yom Kippur, Jewish families gather for a celebratory meal to break their fast.

October 12 honors Respect For Cultural Diversity. Most of us do that every day but when dealing with someone who doesn't, there's always the Moment of Frustration Scream Day!

October 13 brings Breast Cancer Awareness Day – something that affects all of us in one way or another, whether it be ourselves or a loved one.

October 14<sup>th</sup> is Indigenous Peoples' Day, otherwise known as Columbus Day, is a federal holiday in the United States. While Columbus Day commemorates the discovery of the Americas by explorer Christopher Columbus, Indigenous People's Day, or Native American Day, highlights the indigenous people who faced mistreatment the moment Columbus "discovered" them. Whatever you want to call it, this holiday is observed each year on the second Monday of the month.

October 15 is I Love Lucy Day – and who doesn't love Lucy?






