**FROM THE HOA BOARD:** Welcome to the month of December and another year gone. Our snowbirds have come back to the beautiful weather here in Heron Cay – Welcome Home!!

Designs and proposals for a new Heron Cay entrance sign were submitted to corporate for approval and we hope to have a new sign before the end of the year.

Work is continuing with the painting and, in general, sprucing up of the street signs throughout the community.

#### SO, THIS IS DECEMBER - DID YOU KNOW THAT...

Some people get offended when they are wished "Happy Holidays" instead of "Merry Christmas". We need to remember that there are several religious and secular celebrations during the month of December.

December 1 is Eat a Red Apple Day (leftover from Thanksgiving?) and National Christmas Lights Day – already??

December 4 brings us Cookie Day. Yea! The goodies begin!

December 5 and it's Bathtub Party Day and International Ninja Day. Not sure where to go with this.

December 6 is **SAINT NICHOLAS DAY.** This Christian festival is celebrated with particular regard to Saint Nicholas' reputation as a bringer of gifts. In many places, children wake up on this day to find their stockings filled with goodies from St. Nick – or with coal if they've been bad.

December 15 brings us National Ugly Christmas Sweater Day – which is what you'd be wearing if I make your gift. It's also National Wear Your Pearls Day. They will look lovely with that sweater.

December 16 is National Chocolate Covered Anything Day. I'm in!!!!

December 17 and it's National Maple Syrup Day. Get out those pancakes everyone.

December 19. Can't find that perfect gift in the store or online? Well, fear not, because today is National Regifting Day so check that upper shelf in your closet.

December 20 is National Sangria Day (finally, a booze day for December. I was wondering when it would be.)

December 21 to December 25 gives us **PANCHA GANAPATI**, a modern five-day Hindu festival that honors Lord Ganesha, the elephant-headed god of culture, new beginnings, and the arts. Celebrators work to mend past mistakes and bring joy and harmony into five realms of their life: family, friends, associates, culture and religion.

December 21 – **YULE** is typically associated with the winter solstice, which usually occurs around December 21<sup>st</sup> in the northern hemisphere. It is a festival that marks the longest night and the return of longer days. Pagans and Wiccans celebrate the winter solstice from December 21 to January 1. The tradition of Yule or Yuletide was a celebration of feasting, wassailing, drinking and dancing. This ancient holiday celebrated the victory of the Oak King over the Holly King, who symbolize summer and winter, respectively.

December 21 is also National Coquito Day, which celebrates the traditional Puerto Rican holiday rum drink. Yea! Another booze day!! I'm ready to try this Puerto Rican version of eggnog!

December 22 is National Cookie Exchange Day and National Date Nut Bread Day. More goodies!!!

December 23 – **FESTIVUS DAY** is a secular holiday celebrated on December 23 as an alternative to the perceived pressures and commercialism of the Christmas season. It's also National Pfeffernusse Day for all you spicy German cookie lovers.

December 24 is National Eggnog Day. Wait! What should I do with the Coquitos I made on the 21<sup>st</sup>???

December 25 – **CHRISTMAS** – Happy Birthday Jesus! This important celebration remembers the birth of Christians' Lord and Savior. It is a time to share joy and happiness, and to make memories. It's a time to celebrate love and togetherness, when the world seems to sparkle with joy and love. It's a season of warmth, laughter and togetherness.

December 25 – **HANUKKAH** - The 8-day Jewish celebration, also known as the Festival of Lights, is rooted in a 2<sup>nd</sup> century BCE event. In 168 BCE, King Antiochus IV Epiphanes outlawed Jewish practices and desecrated the Temple by installing an altar to Zeus and sacrificing pigs. The Maccabees, a small group of Jewish rebels led by Mattathias and his son, Judas Maccabeus, rebelled and fought back against the Greek-Syrian Seleucids. According to legend, there was only enough oil to keep the Temple's menorah burning for one day but the flame stayed alight for eight days. This year, Hanukkah begins on the evening of December 25<sup>th</sup> and ends on January 2.

December 25 is the celebration of **ZARATHOSHT DISO.** Founded by the Prophet Zoroaster more than 3,000 years ago, Zoroastrianism is one of the world's oldest monotheistic religions. Zoroastrians honor the death of their prophet on this day, typically by visiting a fire temple and offering prayers.

December 26 celebrates **KWANZAA**. This seven-day African-American cultural celebration which ends on January 1st focuses on seven principles, known as Nguzo Saba, which are: unity, self-determination, collective responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity and faith. They all correspond to values that they believe help a person, their family and their community to prosper. The theme for 2024 is "Umoja" (Unity), which strives for and maintains unity in the family, community and nation.

December 26 is also **BOXING DAY**, a holiday celebrated after Christmas Day, occurring on the second day of Christmastide. This tradition originated in the 1800s when Queen Victoria ruled the throne. At the time, it was a day to ensure that upper class Britons gave servants and workers a day off, in addition to giving them a present. The holiday has since evolved into a more commercial occasion for gift-giving.

December 27. Today you celebrate a Make Cut-Out Snowflakes Day, No Interruptions Day, National Fruitcake Day and Visit the Zoo Day. This is gonna be a busy, busy day!

December 28 is National Call a Friend Day and National Chocolate Candy Day. So, can I munch on a Hershey's bar while making those phone calls?

December 29 – National Pepper Pot Day is an unofficial holiday that honors the stew famously associated with George Washington's army during the American Revolution. It's also Still Need To Do Day and Tick Tock Day which reminds us to complete any unfinished business that might need addressing before the end of the year.

December 30 – Falling Needles Family Fest Day. Time to say goodbye to that Christmas tree.

December 31 – National Champagne Day – which makes total sense, because tonight is...



Tickets are \$15 for HOA members, \$20 for non-members. Tickets will be available at the door.




